

# SPORTS REGULATIONS AND GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF P'TIT BIG

### 1. Introduction

The inaugural edition of Belle-Ile-en-Gravel is set for June 1, 2024, orchestrated by the Association Ride en Iles at 9 Quai Vauban, 56360 Le Palais.

Registration signifies unconditional adherence to the Sports Regulations and the General Terms of Sale.

- 2. Sports Regulations Applicable to all event participants, these Regulations comply with the French Cycling Federation's guidelines for Randosportive and cycling hikes, superseding any conflicting Terms of Sale provisions.
- 3. Organizations and Definitions BELLE-ILE-EN-GRAVEL encompasses two hikes: a FFC Randosportive-regulated timed event, and a Gravel course reserved for cyclo-cross bikes. BIG welcomes mountain bikes; P'TIT BIG is open to mountain and electrically assisted bikes.

P'TIT BIG is a non-competitive hike.

Event specifics and rankings for timed sections will be communicated to contestants.

- 4. Conditions of Participation Registration
- 4.1 Exclusively online registration through the official website with secure credit card payment protocol. Registrants receive a handlebar plate as a bib number, non-transferable under any circumstances.
- 4.2 P'TIT BIG, a medical certificate-free event, mandates participants be 16 or older, with minors requiring written parental consent. Registration acceptance is total and irrevocable.

5. Bib Collection Bibs/handlebar plates are issued against an official invitation, ID, and parental consent for minors, available at Chez Lucienne, 9 quai Vauban, Le Palais, during designated times.

#### 6. P'TIT BIG Bib Rate

Registration is priced at 39€, encompassing multiple amenities and services, including the event's GPX track, safety measures, and the exclusive P'tit BIG starter pack.

7. Cancellation by the Participant Registrations are non-refundable unless cancellation insurance was purchased at the point of registration.

# 8. Safety

Participants are responsible for their safety, adherence to traffic laws, helmet usage, and ensuring proper equipment condition.

#### 9. Rescue and Medical Assistance

A comprehensive medical assistance framework will be accessible to all, with a dedicated emergency contact number for participants.

- 10. Supplies Organized supply stations will support participants, who are otherwise expected to be self-sufficient.
- 11. Mandatory and Recommended Equipment
- 11.1 Essential gear includes an approved helmet, GPS/navigation device, repair tools, and an operational mobile phone.
- 11.2 Suggested items include basic medical supplies, lubricant, weather-appropriate apparel, and personal identification.

#### 12. Withdrawal

Procedures for participant withdrawal, particularly in non-emergency situations, are detailed.

# 13. Disqualification

The organizers reserve the right to disqualify participants for noncompliance with the event rules.

14. Changes to Registration and Refund Policy Registration

modifications are subject to the event's established terms and organizer's discretion.

#### 15. Cancellation

- 15.1 Organizational cancellations result in full refunds, minus fees.
  - 15.2 No refunds are issued for force majeure events.

## 16. General Services

The event's road safety and medical services are provided by the local authorities and are outside the organizer's liability.

17. Safety Safety instructions must be followed, with the event's security measures ceasing at the finish line.

# 18. Participant Charter:

Respect and Environment Participants must respect the natural habitats they traverse, with strict rules against littering and offcourse deviations.

# 19. Insurance Responsibilities

Personal accident or civil liability insurance is mandatory for all participants.

## 20. Emergency Number

An emergency number will be provided for urgent medical assistance or to report incidents.

## 21. Modification – Postponement – Cancellation

The Organizer reserves rights to alter event details under certain conditions.

### 22. Media Image Rights

Participants grant the organizer rights to use images from the event unless specifically declined.

## 23. Data Privacy

Participants have rights regarding their personal data, which may be used for specific organizational purposes.
